With policies and mandates changing rapidly, I greatly appreciate your patience wearing and enforcing our mask policy until an official change in policy is announced. We are currently reviewing parent and community mask survey responses, and our long-term plan for masks and desk shields will be communicated to staff and the community after Tuesday night's Board meeting. As you know, once our district drops our universal masking policy, masks will become optional in all school spaces (school buildings, school buses, district offices, etc.).

be asked to stay home. If you have questions, please see your school nurse.






