



## District Salutes Dr. Geraldyn O. Foster

In honor of Women's History Month, the district celebrates the contributions of Dr. Geraldyn O. Foster, the first female Superintendent of Bridgeton Public Schools and namesake of the early childhood center in which the retired educator was instrumental in bringing to the district. Dr. Foster's appointment to the position of Superintendent in Bridgeton began July 1, 1998 following her five years of service as Superintendent of Willingboro Public Schools in Willingboro, NJ. Professionally, Dr. Foster brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to champion the cause of making a positive difference in the Bridgeton school district.

Dr. Foster attended Harvard University for post-graduate work; she received her Doctor of Philosophy degree from Union Institute in Cincinnati,





Ohio and her Master's and Bachelor's degrees from Rowan University (formerly Glassboro State College). Dr. Foster climbed the ladder of success with magnificent grace and style . . . from classroom teacher, Supervisor of Guidance and Testing, Director of Special Services, New Jersey Department of Education Administrator, and Assistant Superintendent of Schools, to her latter years serving as Superintendent of Schools. With the conviction, "If it's going to be ... it begins with me," Dr. Foster remained loyal to providing quality education for all her students, whom she affectionately refers to as her "babies."




