








Elliot Scates is a Literacy Leader!

Mr. Elliot Scates is a literacy leader at Bridgeton High School. Over the last four years, his favorite part of teaching has been interacting with the students. He says, "It's a good feeling to see students engaged and excited about learning." On any given day, Mr. Scates utilizes Achieve 3000 and conferences with students on their improving Lexile Levels. He also implements a Tuesday Tunes for Notice and Note signposts where the students listen to a song and then pick out the signposts from the printed lyrics. Students become so involved that they often offer suggestions for the songs. Another fun activity in Mr. Scates' classroom is Textual Evidence Tic-Tac-Toe. Students are provided a tic-tac-toe board with different literary elements they have learned throughout the year. They must find the elements within the text. Mr. Scates finds that the activity provides opportunities for diverse learners to engage with the stories they read. Mr. Scates' favorite book to read with the students is Percy Jackson and the Olympians: The Lightning Thief. Mr. Scates is an example of #strongertogether as he thanks everyone who

took the time to invest in him as a teacher and provide their advice. Mr. Scates says, "I have been blessed with incredible and inspiring students who motivate me each and every day to be the best version of myself because they deserve it. I have learned just as much from them as they have learned from me. Because of them, I am a better teacher and person."
