



Ms. Douglas is a Pre-Kindergarten teacher and has been an educator in Bridgeton for fourteen years. Her preschool classroom is alive on any given day with busy, smiling students engaged in learning. Her favorite part of teaching is seeing her students grow and develop into incredible children.



As a preschool teacher, Ms. Douglas believes it is her responsibility to set the tone for learning, and part of that is educating the whole child. Ms. Douglas loves to see the students make independent

decisions when they use the interest centers in her classroom.

Allowing students to express their feelings appropriately is essential to Ms. Douglas, and she teaches this skill through music, dance, dramatic play, and storytelling.

During her read-aloud Story Play, she loves to use her favorite story, <u>The Gingerbread Man</u>, where the students come alive and are excited to reenact parts of the story. She notes that repetitiveness allows students to memorize certain parts of

the book, which helps increase language development and literacy knowledge about stories that they demonstrate during the Story Play.

She also loves to involve her students in journal writing; yes, journal writing in preschool! Her students "write" for two minutes a day. Ms. Douglas also utilizes the Dual Language practice of Gomez and Gomez and teaches to the top 25% of the class.

**Technology Update** The district technology department is constantly working to improve connectivity for all stakeholders. Over the last several

months, we in the technology office have been attempting to locate the source of the issues with the district WiFi and hard-wired networks. We are pleased to report that the team has found several problems that caused the massive slowdowns over the past months. These issues have a combined effect of decreasing performance for an enterprise-level network. As our network grows and becomes more advanced, so do the challenges. This past year, we have sought to upgrade the district to the latest WiFi standards. Unfortunately, global supply chain issues and the pandemic have delayed this upgrade. We are currently preparing to work with equipment that is not standard between the different schools. Our cur-

rent equipment still functions as expected. However, given the number of new systems needing to use the equipment, we sometimes exhaust available resources. Rest assured that we are fully aware of the needs and issues of each building regarding the district network. We expect to have all new identical equipment for each school as the global supply chain allows. We thank everyone for their continued patience and understanding.
