












QML Teacher Pens Children's Picture Book

Junior Cruz Bautista is an eighth- grade student attending the ExCEL Program. Junior has attended ExCEL for the past three years and has become a model student and is a member of the School Safety Patrol. Junior comes from a small but very close-knit family. He also has a brother who attends ExCEL.



During the past two school years of this pandemic, all

drinking fountains in all Bridgeton Schools ceased operation. The district then provided each building with bottled water for all staff and students to enjoy. While in his Science class during a lesson on recycling, Junior suggested ExCEL should take part in a recycling project by recycling all our drinking bottles. With the help of his Science teacher, Junior started to do research on recycling programs. Contact was made with the Pepsi Company and he proposed what they wanted to do. Junior and his classmates put up a display board about recycling to encourage all to participate. The Pepsi Company then provided six large recycling bins for the school. Junior set a goal of collecting 500 pounds of bottles to recycle this school year. Junior and two other students faithfully empty the containers weekly and record the weight on a chart displayed in the cafeteria of the building, for all to see. They have collected about 300 pounds of bottles at ExCEL.


