

- More students reading on grade level compared to our Fall 2021 baseline
- More students enrolling in Algebra this year
- One-to-one device to student ratio maintained across our district
- Hotspots remain available for any family that needs one
- Expanded access to tutoring
- Consistent reduction in the number of students labeled as "at risk" on our SEL screener
- We are transitioning successfully to a dependence on renewable solar energy
- We are expanding our partnerships with local farmers for locally sourced fruits, vegetables, spices, meats, and meals for our families.
- Enhanced use of the Genesis parent portal
- Enhanced mental health supports for staff and students
- Enhanced employee assistance benefits




