



While we are closer to Dr. King's ideal America, recent events at the Capitol as well as repeated incidents of Blacks being killed disproportionately at the hands of police remind us we still have a long way to go. For those of us who embarked on a career in education with a heart for service, a love for humanity, and a desire for a brighter tomorrow, we have our work cut out for us. School is still the place where we learn reading, writing, and arithmetic. School is also the place where we must reinforce values like fairness, forgiveness, honesty, kindness, humility, and gratitude.

District-wide, we will continue delivering critical and needed lessons around teamwork, tolerance, and responsibility, lessons embedded in our SEL curriculum. Recognizing that students' socialization opportunities have been greatly reduced during our 100% remote period, we will continue to monitor COVID-19 cases in our school community and meet with our Pandemic Response teams in hopes of returning to in-person learning as quickly as possible. In the meantime, our transmission rates are high, and we will remain 100% remote until further notice, at least through February 16th, with students projected to resume hybrid instruction on **February 18th.**

VACCINATION INFORMATION

Staff can register for a COVID-19 vaccine through a secure state website using the following link https://covidvaccine.nj.gov/. Please also help us as we plan for resuming in -person learning by completing our 15 second staff vaccination survey.



Travel should be avoided unless necessary.



Masks should be mandated and worn by everyone outside their home.



Gyms should be avoided and required to close.



Schools: Enable remote learning for all students. All government levels should invest in remote learning.



Gatherings should be avoided with people outside the immediate household.



Bars should be avoided and required to close.



Restaurants should max at 25% capacity. Local governments must assist in expanding outdoor dining opportunities. Customers should use takeout or eat outdoors socially distanced.
