
Superintendent's School Opening Bulldog Briefing

Happy Monday Bridgeton Team!

With so many days off during the month of November, I hope this is a month filled with family time and reflection on those things for which you are grateful. I would also like to formally wish all of our veterans and family members of veterans a Happy Veterans Day!

As you know, we continue to closely monitor positive cases of COVID-19 in our school community. As cases throughout the country continue to rise, we remain in regular communication with our local health department to help determine if and when we would scale back and transition back to 100% remote. The health department informed us this week that another QML staff member tested positive on 10/23 while the school was 100% remote, taking our total number of confirmed cases to:



- 1 Positive and Confirmed Staff Case at BHS (Building currently open and operational)
- 1 Positive and Confirmed Staff Case at Cherry Street (Building currently open and operational)
- 1 Positive and Confirmed Staff Case at Broad Street (Building currently open and operational)
- 1 Positive and Confirmed Staff Case at Indian Avenue (Building currently open and operational)

Staff Safety

We are in compliance and will remain in compliance with Governor Murphy's new workplace safety measures which require:

- Workers to keep at least 6 feet from each other to the maximum extent possible.
- Workers and visitors to wear a face mask, with limited exceptions.
- Employers to provide masks to workers at the company's expense.
