
Kudos to West Avenue School for doing its part in preparing our students for a global future. Staff at West recently brought the curriculum alive by inviting Native American drummers (pictured


Giving our students access to rigorous high level instruction, despite competing factors such as interrupted instruction, language acquisition challenges, and socioeconomics is our duty as ed-

Thank you for getting the word out about our new virtual tutoring resource. Please continue to help us spread the word!















## **BSS's Gallery Walk Features Student Art**
















## Red Blanket Drummers at West Ave. School






The Red Blanket Drummers, a group comprised of local members of the Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Tribe, came to educate and entertain students at West Avenue School.
